It is hereby declared by the PARISH COUNCIL of WOODHOUSE that the Recreation Ground acquired by them under the terms of a conveyance dated the Eighteenth day of March, One Thousand nine hundred and thirty seven BETWEEN William Montague Curson-Herrick of the first part the Right Honourable Francis Richard Henry Penn Earl Howe P.C. Sir Fitzroy Hamilton Anstruther-Gough-Calthorpe and Arthur Edwin Mulholland of the second part and the Parish Council of Woodhouse of the third part in respect of which Heraldic Panels, the official emblems of a "King George's Field", have been provided by King George's Fields Foundation shall be preserved in perpetuity as a Memorial to His Late Majesty King George V. under the provisions of the King George's Fields Foundation and shall henceforth be known as "King George's Field".
